



FACT SHEET

San Francisco General Hospital and Trauma Center's new inpatient care building:

- **LOCATION:** Potrero Avenue between 22nd and 23rd streets -- on the main lawn of the current hospital campus
- **HEIGHT:** Nine stories -- with two floors underground and seven above
- **SIZE:** 448,000 square feet
- **BEDS:** 284 beds (32 more than current hospital)
- **FUTURE LOCATION OF SERVICES:**
 - Basement 2: Dietary, Pharmacy, Cardiology, Pulmonary, Diagnostic Imaging (X-Ray), Sterile Processing
 - Basement 1: Operating Rooms (14), Pre-op and Post-op, Endoscopy, Blood Bank
 - First Floor: Emergency Department and Trauma Center
 - Second Floor: Labor & Delivery, Postpartum, Pediatrics, Neonatal Intensive Care
 - Third Floor: Intensive Care Units (ICU)
 - Fourth Floor: Step Down Medical/Surgical, Step Down ICU, Dialysis
 - Fifth Floor: Medical/Surgical Unit, Forensic Unit
 - Sixth Floor: Medical/Surgical Unit
 - Seventh Floor: Medical/Surgical Unit - Acute Care for the Elderly, Palliative Care, Department of Public Health Operations Center (for citywide emergencies), Roof Garden
- **SEISMIC SAFETY:** Base isolated hospital building will be able to move 30 inches in any direction. Meets state standards.
- **GREEN:** The goal is to reach the Gold level of Leadership in Energy and Environmental Design (LEED) certification
- **ART:** Art work selected by the San Francisco Arts Commission

- ARCHITECT: Fong & Chan Architects of San Francisco
- CONSTRUCTION: Webcor Builders, with Construction Management by Jacobs
- MANAGEMENT: San Francisco Department of Public Works
- COST: \$887.4 million to construct. These funds were approved when voters passed Proposition A in November 2008 by an 84% margin. Thank you San Francisco! The city will finance the rebuild through general obligation bonds.
- TIMING: Scheduled to open 2015
- CURRENT SERVICES: SFGH will continue to operate during the construction of the new hospital. There will be no reduction in inpatient, outpatient or emergency services.
