Highlights

What's New?

1. The ANSA items are embedded
2. There is a new section where the clinician can indicate the areas of focus for treatment
3. There is a new area where the clinician can indicate that the client is on “Maintenance”
 - a. Maintenance is defined as a client performing optimally and the goal of treatment is to prevent deterioration in level of functioning. Providers wanted a mechanism to indicate that such clients should not be included on ANSA objectives.
 - b. In order to qualify to be on “maintenance” the client cannot have any ANSA items rated as a 3
 - c. We have created a system that checks for scores of 3. This is displayed as 2 separate check boxes where each represents a set of ANSA items. Unfortunately, there is no way to merge this into one checkbox
4. Unfortunately, the carry forward option is only available once the clinician has completed one entry in the new form.

What's the difference between the Long and the Short form?

1. Medical History and Physical Health
 - a. Long: discreet questions
 - i. Last Physical Exam
 - ii. Date and results of most recent PPD
 - iii. Checklist of Medical History
2. Criminal Justice History
 - a. Short: Criminal Justice History current/past (Y/N)
 - b. Long: discreet questions
 - i. Assault on persons within last 90 days or Past (Y/N)
 - ii. Property Damage within last 90 days or Past (Y/N)
 - iii. Weapons Involved within last 90 days or Past (Y/N)
 - iv. Probation within last 90 days or Past (Y/N)

- NOTE: BHS does not expect the majority of our clients to be considered Maintenance Only. Instead, this option is designed for specific instances where clients are functioning optimally and the goal of treatment is to maintain their current level of functioning.
- Providers wanted to a way to exclude such clients from the ANSA Objective
- To qualify for Maintenance Only, no ANSA item can be rated as 3.
- These boxes represent the analysis of any 3's.
