#### 1) CALL TO ORDER

#### 2) APPROVAL OF THE JULY 20, 2010 COMMUNITY AND PUBLIC HEALTH COMMITTEE MINUTES

Action Taken: The Committee voted unanimously to approve the minutes of the July 20, 2010 meeting.

#### 3) INPUT FOR THE HEALTHY SAN FRANCISCO ANNUAL REPORT

Tangerine Brigham, Deputy Director of Health reviewed the outline of the report. Ms. Brigham stated that the Annual Report is used by various community groups to obtain information about Healthy San Francisco.

The following are highlights of the discussion of this item:

The Committee thanked Ms. Brigham for the comprehensiveness of the report outline and for her continued excellent work overseeing Healthy San Francisco.

The final report will include an analysis of participants who dis-enrolled and/or "churned" in and out of enrollment. Ms. Brigham noted that non-payment of enrollment fees does not lead to disenrollment.



Last year, approximately \$3M was collected through participation fees and \$300,000 was collected through point-of-service fees.

The final report will contain data on whether providing care through a medical home works to coordinate care outside of primary care.

One of the obstacles to having a larger amount of quality data is that it requires hospitals and other partners to collect information on populations for which they will not be reimbursed for services.

Ms. Brigham will attempt to collect data on non-English speaking users who access the HSF website.

**4) COMMUNITY ORIENTED PRIMARY CARE (COPC)**

Marcellina Ogbu, COPC Chief Operations Officer, and Lisa Johnson, COPC Medical Director gave the presentation.

The following are highlights from the discussion of this item:

The following clinics have already initiated COPC: Ocean Park, Castro Mission, Maxine Hall, Cole Street, and Southeast health center.

Services that may be provided at the health center vary per site but may include: nutrition, social work, public health nurse, health education, pharmacy, podiatry, nurse visits, lab, and dental.

There are eligibility workers at each DPH health center that can assist patients with enrolling in HSF.

As part of the integration, DPH is insuring that there are examine rooms for primary care provision at clinics that have historically only provide mental health services.

COPC collections are handled by SFGH because of its extensive finance department and collections systems. The Committee requested that future COPC updates include data on self-pay for uninsured people who were billed for COPC services but did not pay; updates should also will include the amount recovered through various SFGH collection activities.

The Committee requested that the SFGH JCC should receive COPC quality and ambulatory clinic data on an ongoing basis.
