City Offers Apartment Owners and Property Managers Help with City Codes

San Francisco, CA -- Help is at hand for hotel operators, apartment owners, property managers seeking to understand and follow city laws to protect the safety and quality of housing for tenants in San Francisco.

The San Francisco Department of Public Health will be offering a free workshop on healthy housing and related city codes on Tuesday, October 27, from noon to 5 p.m. at the Milton Marks Conference Center Auditorium, 455 Golden Gate Avenue, San Francisco. Those in attendance will be able to talk to representatives from agencies throughout the City that enforce many of the rules and regulations that govern rental housing.

The half day event will address a wide range of important topics relating to the safe and healthy management of hotels and multi-unit facilities:

- Building, Fire and Health Codes
- New approaches to pest control (bed bugs, cockroaches, mice, rats and pesticide use)
- New law on Healthy Housing/Guidelines to effective building management
