




Figure 2. City Clinic visits by gender and orientation.




Figure 3. Average number of recent\* sex partners for City Clinic visits by gender and sexual orientation. \*Recall period is 3 months.

## June is LGBT Pride Month

The San Francisco Department of Public Health (SFDPH) will be honoring LGBT Pride Month through its continued efforts to promote positive sexual health and its participation in the annual San Francisco Pride Celebration and Parade. On Pink Saturday, June 27<sup>th</sup>, SFDPH staff and the Healthy Penis will be in the Castro to provide information on citywide sexual health services and the need for routine sexual health screening, as well as to distribute condoms and lube. On Sunday, June 28<sup>th</sup>, staff from across SFDPH will be walking in the Pride Parade.

In addition to providing confidential low-cost diagnosis and treatment of sexually transmitted diseases, City Clinic also provides emergency contraception, HIV testing and linkage to care, Post-Exposure Prophylaxis (PEP) for HIV, and assistance with accessing Pre-Exposure Prophylaxis (PrEP) for HIV. *TQN*
