




Figure 2. City Clinic visits by gender and orientation.




Figure 3. Average number of recent* sex partners for City Clinic visits by gender and sexual orientation. *Recall period is 3 months.

SFDPH Supports San Francisco's LGBT Pride Events

The San Francisco Department of Public Health (SFDPH) will continue its long tradition of participating in the annual San Francisco LGBT Pride Parade on June 26, 2016 with its largest ever contingent, on four floats. Several branches of the Population Health Division will be represented in the parade, including Community Health Equity & Promotion, Disease Prevention and Control, Environmental Health, and Bridge HIV. Representatives from the San Francisco Health Network will include staff and patients from Laguna Honda Hospitals and Rehabilitation Center, Zuckerberg San Francisco General Hospital, and HIV Health Services.

The floats will be decorated with banners highlighting Laguna Honda Hospital's 150 years of service in San Francisco, the opening of the new Zuckerberg San Francisco General, and a number of SFDPH health campaigns, including Project PrIDE, which focuses on supporting PrEP use and engagement in HIV Care among men who have sex with men (MSM) of color and transgender persons in order to reduce HIV disparities in San Francisco. SFDPH will be distributing condom packets with sexual health information throughout the parade route. We hope to see many of you there. Happy Pride! *TT/TQN*
