


Figure 1. Monthly STD trends for San Francisco. Syphilis cases different scale.





Figure 2. City Clinic visits by gender and orientation.

The theme for this year's San Francisco LGBT Pride is "A Celebration of Diversity." The annual parade will take place on Sunday, June 25, 2017.

The San Francisco Department of Public Health (SFDPH) has participated in the SF LGBT Pride Parade for many years. In 2016, we marched with our largest contingent yet, made up of people from multiple teams throughout both the Population Health Division and SF Health Network of SFDPH.

The 2017 SFDPH parade participant list currently includes staff from the Community Health Equity & Promotion Branch (CHE&P), which is coordinating the SFDPH Pride activities, as well as Environmental Health, Communications, Laguna Honda Hospital, San Francisco/Marin Medical Services, HIV Health Services, Zuckerberg San Francisco General Hospital, and Bridge HIV. We will be distributing condoms; lube; information about sexual health, STD prevention and care, and HIV pre-exposure prophylaxis (PrEP); and additional public health resource information along the parade route.
