

HIV Pre-Exposure Prophylaxis in San Francisco: The DEMO Project

We are excited to announce that San Francisco City Clinic, in collaboration with Bridge HIV, has launched **The Demo Project**. The Demo Project is the first demonstration project in the United States assessing the feasibility, safety and acceptability of pre-exposure prophylaxis (PrEP) implementation in STD clinics. PrEP is a new HIV prevention method that involves HIV negative people taking anti-HIV medications daily to help prevent HIV infection. Several studies have shown that PrEP can reduce the risk of becoming HIV-infected when taken as part of a package of prevention services. The Demo Project will enroll up to 300 HIV-uninfected gay and bi men and transgender women at the **San Francisco City Clinic**, and an additional 200 participants at a Department of Health STD clinic in Miami, Florida. The project launched at the end of September and to date we have enrolled 57 participants in San Francisco and 25 in Miami. HIV negative gay and bi men and transwomen interested in participating in the project should call (415) 487-5537 to schedule a PrEP screening visit or inquire about the project at their next City Clinic visit.
