- State in renewal discussions with CMS for 1115 Medicaid Waiver, which expires August 31st
- Mayor Newsom announced creation of a Task Force to assess impact of health reform on the City

“Those providers that organize and deliver a significant level of health care and other health-related services to uninsured, Medicaid, and other vulnerable patients.”
