* Under California’s August 18, 2021 “[Beyond the Blueprint for Industry and Business Sectors](#),” children under 12 who are not eligible for vaccination at this time will have to show proof of a negative COVID-19 test to enter the indoor event. Operators or hosts of events that sold tickets or registered attendees before August 12, 2021, may accept proof that attendees age 12 and older are either fully vaccinated *or have received a negative COVID-19 test in the past 72 hours* until September 15. Beginning on September 15, a negative COVID-19 test will no longer be sufficient—only proof of full vaccination will be acceptable for attendees age 12 and over.

** Plans must be submitted to HealthPlan@sfcityatt.org at least ten business days before the planned event or, if earlier, ten business days before the date on which tickets will begin to be sold or offered to the public. The host or organizer does not need advance written approval to proceed with the event. But if the Health Officer identifies deficiencies in the plan, DPH will contact the host or organizer, and the host or organizer is required to use its best efforts to work with DPH to address any and all deficiencies before the event.
