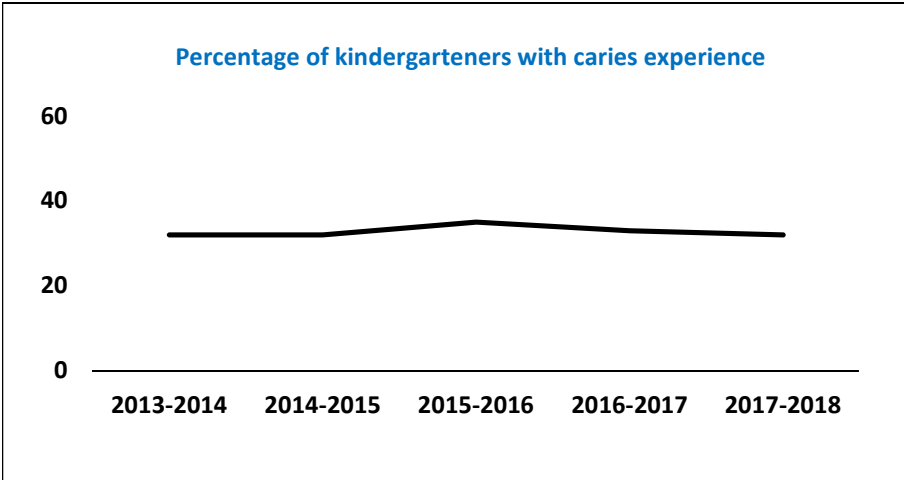


# San Francisco Children’s Oral Health Strategic Plan Indicators<sup>1</sup>

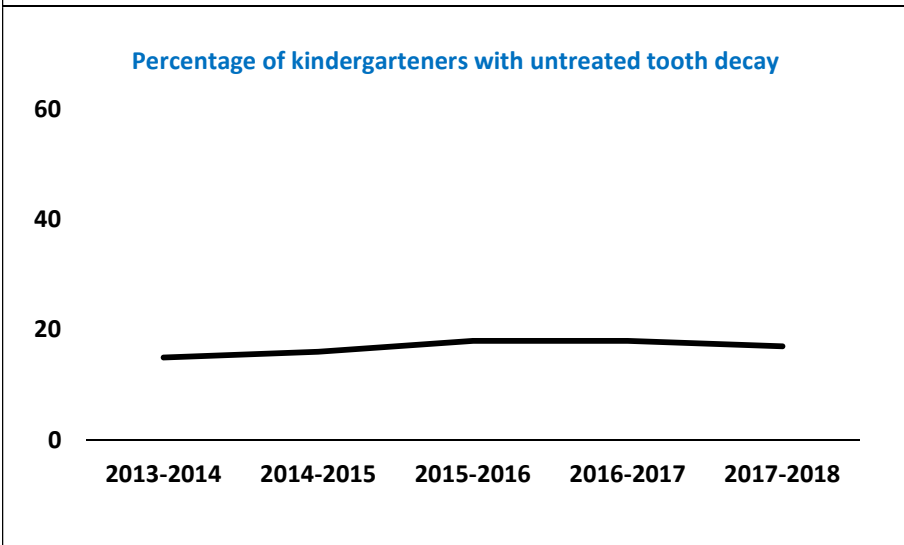
## Oral Health Status & Disparities



**Strategic Plan Target:**

Reduce the percentage of kindergarteners with caries experience from 32% in 2013 to **27% in 2020**

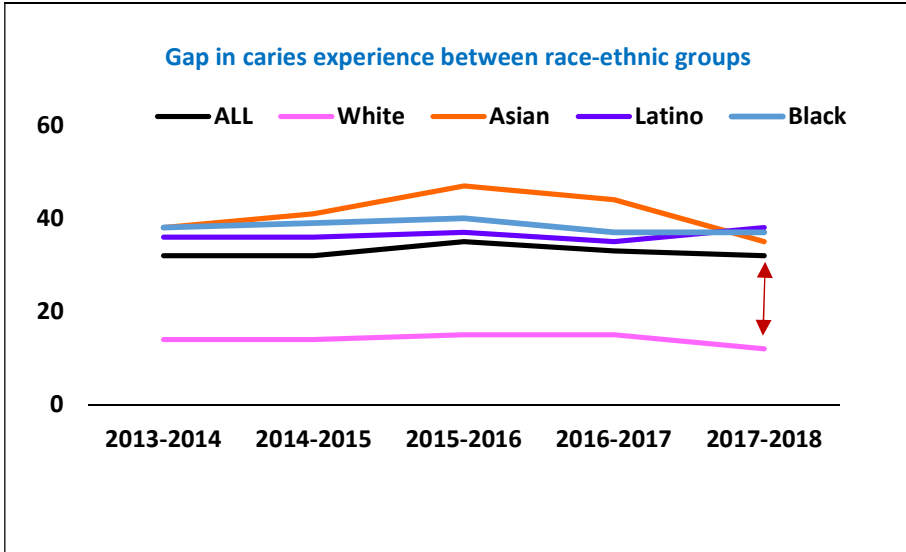
**Status in 2017-18: 32%**



**Strategic Plan Target:**

Reduce the percentage of kindergarteners with untreated dental decay from 15% in 2013 to **8% in 2020**

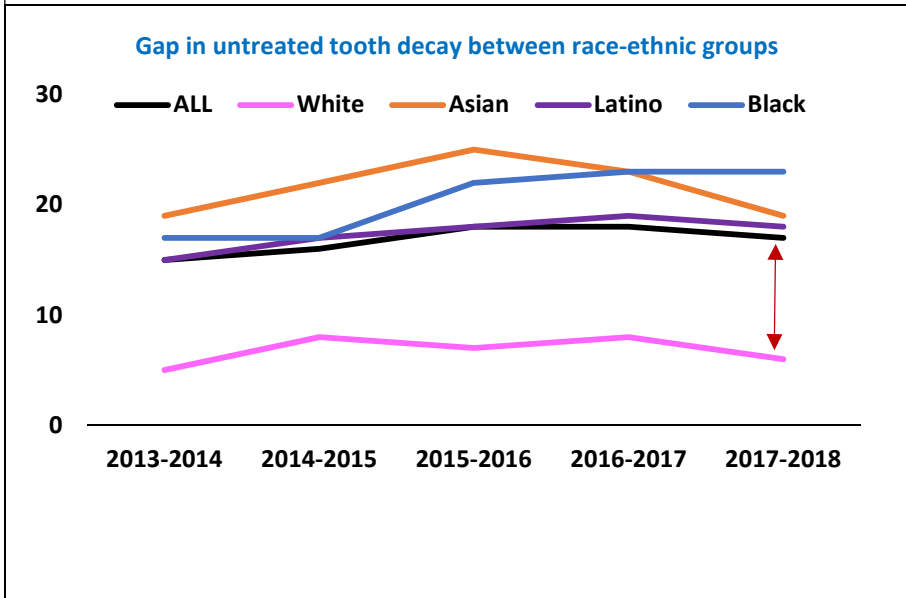
**Status in 2017-18: 17%**



**Strategic Plan Target:**

Reduce the gap in caries experience between race-ethnic groups from a 18 percentage point difference in 2013 to a **15 percentage point** difference by 2020

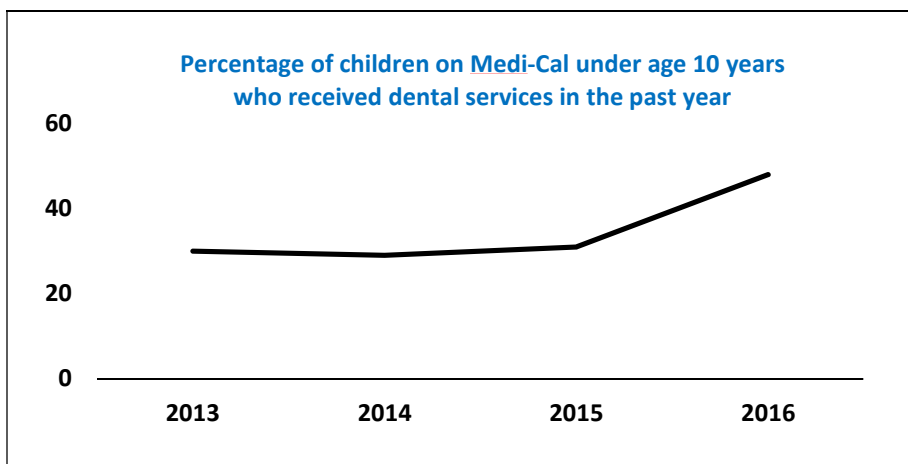
**Status in 2017-18: 20 percentage points**



**Strategic Plan Target:**

Reduce the gap in untreated dental decay between race-ethnic groups from an 10 percentage point difference in 2013 to a **6 percentage point** difference by 2020

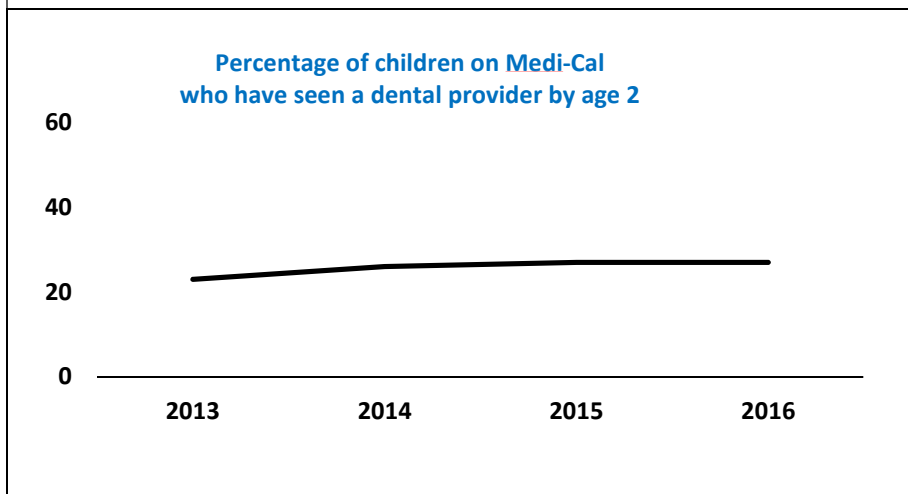
**Status in 2017-18: Gap exceeds 10 percentage points**



**Strategic Plan Target:**

Increase the percentage of children on Medi-Cal under age 10 who received any dental service billed to Denti-Cal during the past year by an absolute change of **7% by 2020 relative to 2016**

**Status in 2016: 48%**



**Strategic Plan Target:**

Increase the percentage of children on Medi-Cal who have seen a dental provider by age 2, by an absolute change of **4% by 2020 relative to 2016**

**Status in 2016: 27%**

Caries experience was defined as one or more decayed (untreated) or filled (treated) primary tooth. Untreated decay was defined as one or more primary tooth with untreated decay.
