#### DRAFT POLICY RECOMMENDATIONS: OPERATIONS & SERVICES

1. Support creation of safe injection services in SF

4. Consider expanding the types of drug consumption allowed on-site.

#### **PROGRAM PLANNING & MANAGEMENT**

7. Design safe injection services as a safe, clean, and welcoming space for people who inject drugs.

- 8. Recognize legal and real estate barriers to operating safe injection services and devise necessary contingency plans.

- 9. Conduct an assessment to determine the optimal service scale, capacity, work flow, hours of operation, and staffing mix.

10. Develop clear and measurable program goals and metrics.

- People in early recovery (less than 1 year)
- 43% former injection drug users
- 25 neighborhoods represented
- Jun 2017 Jul 2017

- 1 out of 5 Hispanic/Latinx




