WHEELCHAIR ACCESSIBILITY

The San Francisco Safe Injection Services Task Force will be held at 25 Van Ness, Room 610. The building is accessible by wheelchair on Van Ness Avenue. The 6th floor is accessible by elevator and room 610 is accessible by a chair lift.
