### **DISABILITY ACCESS**

1. MHB Retreat meetings is at 1099 Sunnydale Avenue, San Francisco, CA. 94134. Access is accessible. Regular meetings are held at 1380 Howard Street, (corner of 10<sup>th</sup> and Howard Streets), in Room 226, 207, 424 or Room 515. The closest accessible BART station and Muni Metro Station is the Civic Center station, at the intersection of Market, Grove and Hyde Streets. A second Muni Metro station within a few blocks is the Van Ness Station, located at Van Ness and Market. Accessible MUNI lines serving the location are the 9 San Bruno, 47 Van Ness, 14 Mission, and 71 Haight/Noreiga. Also, the J, K, L, M, and N lines underground. 2. 1380 Howard Street is accessible to wheelchairs. Elevators, doorways, restrooms, and the meeting room are wheelchair accessible. Accessible curbside parking has been designated on Grace Alley.

3. Rooms 226, 207, 424 and 515 are accessible to persons using wheelchairs and others with disabilities. Assistive listening devices, materials in other alternative formats, American Sign Language interpreters and other accommodations will be made available upon request. 5. For Special Hearings at other locations, please call for directions or bus information. All locations will be accessible.

In order to assist the City's efforts to accommodate persons with severe allergies, environmental illnesses, multiple chemical sensitivity or related disabilities, attendees at public meetings are reminded that other attendees may be sensitive to various chemical based products.
