Jordan Wellington, Esq., Director of Compliance at Vicente Sederberg LLC, to present information to Task Force and answer questions regarding adult use legalization considerations.

Jordan Wellington Biography: Jordan Wellington, Esq., Director of Compliance at Vicente Sederberg LLC, graduated cum laude from Brooklyn Law School in May of 2009. In 2013, Jordan served as the sole legislative staffer assigned to shepherd the legislation implementing Amendment 64 and the legalization of marijuana through the Colorado General Assembly. Jordan was then hired by the Colorado Department of Revenue's Marijuana Enforcement Division to serve as its sole policy analyst during the development and drafting of the rules governing retail marijuana and the revised rules governing medical marijuana. Since joining Vicente Sederberg, LLC, Jordan advised policy makers and regulators from across the United States and other countries on the implementation of responsible and efficient cannabis regulations, including California, Minnesota, Rhode Island, Vermont, Florida, Spain, Louisiana, France, Germany, Denmark, Columbia, and Jamaica. In addition, Jordan has helped countless cannabis businesses across the country to build compliant facilities and develop compliant standard operating procedures.
