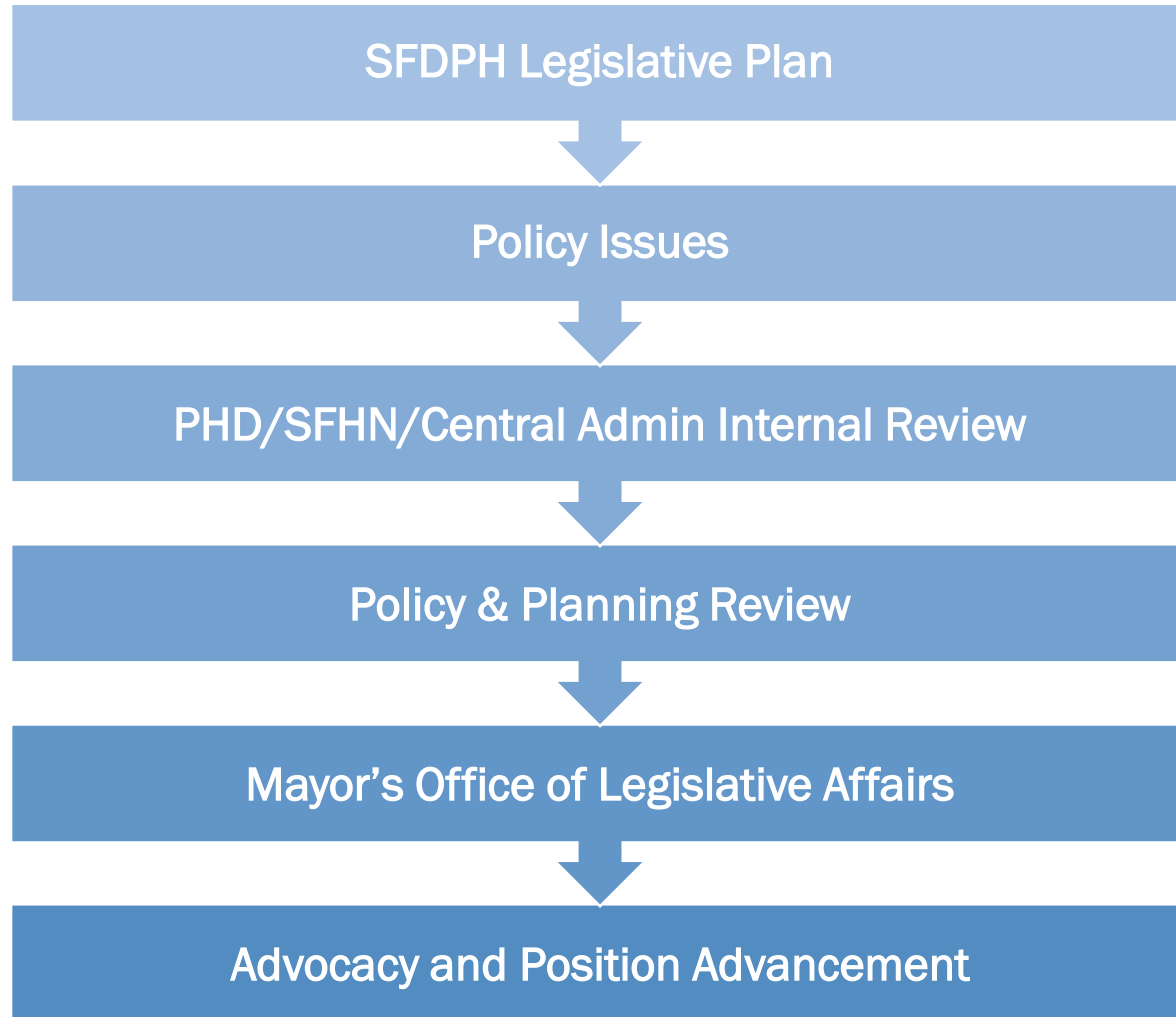

- Developed with input from SFDPH content experts

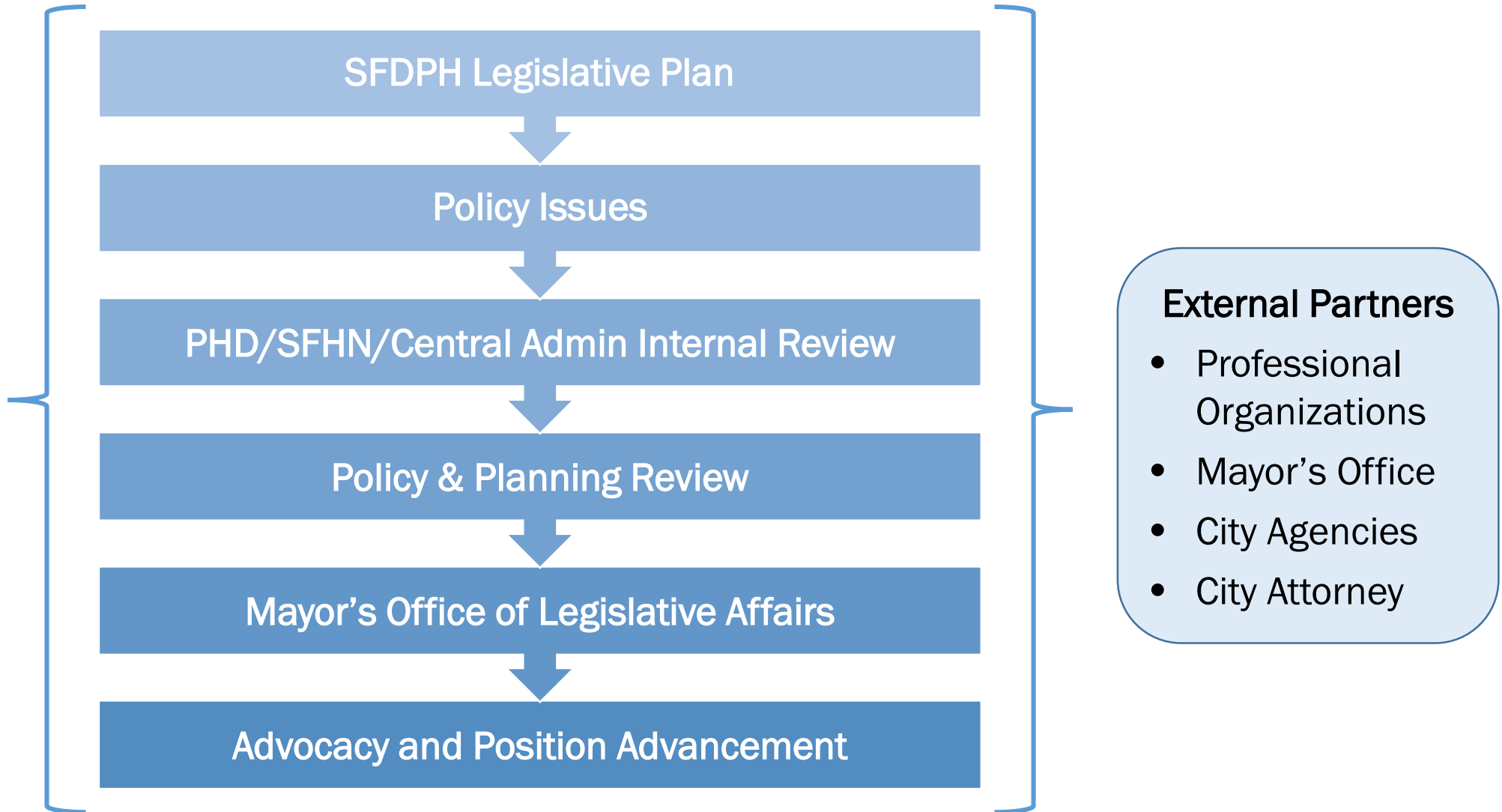
# Process for Reviewing and Advancing Policy

# Process for Reviewing and Advancing Policy



- **Actively monitored over 100 bills and official positions recommended for 22 bills. Key issue areas included:**

## Behavioral Health



- Substance Use Treatment
- Overdose Prevention Programs



- Conservatorship
- EMS Alternative Destination/Sobering Center



- Integration, funding, and workforce

## Key issue areas:



- ❑ HIV Prevention

- **State Health Care Updates**

- Increase access to health care (expand Covered California premium support, expand Medi-Cal to undocumented adults age 19-25)
- Reinstate individual mandate
- Control prescription drug costs

- **California Advancing and Innovating Medi-Cal - CalAIM**

- A multi-year initiative by DHCS to improve the quality of life and health outcomes of Medi-Cal population by implementing broad delivery system, program and payment reform across the program.



- The second year of the two year session begins January 2020.
- Governor's Budget
  - FY 19/20
  - FY 20/21 January proposal
