# Citywide Food Support (Grocery Programs)

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*Grocery bags distributed at pop-up pantry sites, via home-delivery, and network of community-based organizations*

Projected Expenditure	Impact to date	Providers
\$11.9 million	720,000 grocery bags 19,400 people	San Francisco-Marin Food Bank

Details (from Pop-Up Pantry):

- Mostly Asian (66%), followed by Latinx/Hispanic (22%)
- Most speak a primary language other than English (73%)
- About 42% are seniors age 60+

# Great Plates Delivered SF

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*Temporary senior meal program that leverages local restaurants and food providers to prepare and deliver meals to eligible seniors*

Projected Expenditure	Impact to date	Providers
\$53.9 million	1.9 million meals 3,600 people	SF New Deal, Off The Grid, Moonstar

## Details:

- Mostly Asian/Pacific Islander (72%)
- Primarily live in western and southern neighborhoods (Sunset, Richmond, Ingleside, Excelsior)
- Supported by more than 80 local restaurants and providers

# Aging & Disability Nutrition Network

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*Network of 13 community-based organizations that provide food via home delivery and in-person pick up*

Projected Expenditure	Impact to date	Providers
\$3 million	2.6 million meals (home-delivery and takeaway) 23,000 people	Various*

## Details:

- Mostly Asian/Pacific Islander (56%), followed by Black/African American (14%)
- Live throughout city: many are downtown (28% in Tenderloin, SOMA);  
congregate meal participation high in Sunset and Richmond (28%)

*\*Network of aging/disability-focused organizations, such as Meals on Wheels, Bayview Senior Services, Centro Latino, Self-Help for the Elderly, Project Open Hand, etc*

# Isolation/Quarantine Food Helpline

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*Meal and grocery delivery to food insecure households unable to safely obtain food without leaving their home during isolation or quarantine period*

Projected Expenditure	Impact to date	Providers
\$2.5 million	75,000 meals 32,000 grocery bags 5,200 households 18,000 people	Meals On Wheels, Shanti Project, Market on Market

## Details:

- Mostly Latinx/Hispanic (55%), followed by Asian/Pacific Islander (12%)
- Primarily live in south, southeast, and Mission neighborhoods
- Range from single person to large households; approximately 30% of households are 5 or more people



# Street Feeding

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*Meal delivery to unsheltered residents to reduce their need to travel across the city for food and help mitigate virus spread.*

Projected Expenditure	Impact to date	Providers
\$1.6 million	10,150 meals	The Salvation Army

## Details:

- Most meals distributed in Fall 2020 to encampments in the Mission, Bayview, SOMA, the Haight, the Panhandle, and the Avenues
- Additional meals distributed in Winter 2021 to Design District (Potrero/SOMA) to support HSOC operations

# Community Efforts

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*Meal and grocery delivery of culturally-relevant food to sustain community-driven food efforts for high-risk populations*

Projected Expenditure	Impact to date	Providers
\$8.1 million	In development	CANA/Mission Food Hub, Arcadio's Produce, SF New Deal (Feed and Fuel Chinatown), EatSF, TNDC, Bayanihan Equity Center, Samoan Community Development Center

# Community Efforts

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## Details:

- 86,000 grocery bags being distributed through Latinx-focused organizations (January – June)
- 3,000 Chinatown SRO residents receiving 5 weekly meals through Feed and Fuel Chinatown (January – April)
- 700 Halal households and 310 Black/African American households receiving EatSF vouchers (Spring 2021)
- 320 Filipino and Samoan households receiving culturally relevant groceries (January – June)
- Supplemental grocery distribution in the Tenderloin
