5. Priority 4: Information and Referrals	Work Group members discussed how to improve work on information and referrals (I&R), and what next steps might look like. The following points, questions/concerns, and ideas for moving forward emerged: Questions/Concerns/Areas for Development (I&R) People don't know what resources exist and how to access them Resources not always user-friendly for families/individuals and/or organizations Stigma related to food insecurity Unknown whether food referrals have been successful (there is no feedback loop for Food Locator) Resources not centralized Databases not always updated Challenges with client/individual interactions with Food Bank CBOs often acting as intermediaries and tech-support; many families/individuals in need don't have tech How to best reach people?
