


San Francisco Food Security Task Force (FSTF) Minutes

2. Welcome, roll call, introductions	Anne welcomed everyone and everyone introduced themselves.	None

4. Strategic Planning Update	Anne reviewed the FSTF strategic plan priorities and discussed how Information and Referral has been advanced through the development of food referral through 311. The task force discussed how the priorities in the plan draws systemic issues together and we need leverage this. Because of the increased need for food, there is now much more engagement in food security by organizations and businesses throughout San Francisco. <p>5. San Francisco Covid Command Center Feeding Group update</p>	<p>Andrea Jorgensen, San Francisco Covid Command Center Feeding Group Leader Provided an update to the task force. She reviewed the organization chart for the Covid Command Center, the timeline for the emergency response, Response Overview, Roles/Responsibilities of the Feeding Unit, Accomplishments, Call to Action. Sarah discussed how smaller food organizations don't have the capacity to develop contingency plans and it would be helpful for the Feeding Group to support the development of contingency plans. <p>6. Presentation by Office of Racial Equity</p>	<p>Shakirah Simley, Director of the Office of Racial Equity (ORE) presented on ORE's progress, and important updates. She reviewed the vision of the office, the mandates of the office, the Equity Team at the Emergency Operations Center, the accomplishments to date. Update on Sugary Drink Distributor Tax Advisory Committee (SDDTAC)</p>	<p>Michelle Kim provided an update on the SDDTAC. \$1.6 M from Sugary Drink Distributor Tax was allocated to food security projects. There is an open membership seat representing SFDPH and food security. This membership seat will be required to provide updates to the Food Security Task Force. The FSTF can make recommendations to DPH for individuals who should hold this seat.</p>	<p>As noted.</p>
<p>9. Update on Services and Gaps</p>	<p><u>Children’s Council (Raegan Sales)</u> Children's Council of San Francisco is piloting two new projects to address food insecurity via our connection to family child care educators, with targeted outreach in equity zones and priority populations. With CACFP Provider Meals, family child care educators will be cooking and distributing three meals per week to all of the families regularly in their care, regardless of whether the site is currently open or closed. This will impact household-level food insecurity for child care educators (the vast majority of whom closed or had significantly reduced income due to the pandemic) and for the households of children in their care. With the Family Meals Pass program, families receiving child care subsidies will receive a pass that can be redeemed for three family meals each week. Meals will be available for pickup in the evening hours at community resource locations in the participant's community (example locations: Bayview YMCA, FRCs, etc). Both pilots are funded for four weeks and we are working to secure funding to continue as long as the need exists in our community</p> <p><u>CF Caseload Updates (Jeimil Belamide)</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • June 2020 - 61,500 Households • June 2019 – 44,000 Households <p>Pandemic EBT</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • State administered benefit that provided extra food benefits to students receiving Free/Reduced school lunches . • Those not on CalFresh are allowed to apply online @ ca.p-ebt.org • July 15th last day • Official data has not been released, but initial findings show that San Francisco students that were eligible for this benefit had a very good take up rate. 	

	<p><u>San Francisco Health Plan (Tuyen Tran)</u> SFHP funded pilot, providers can refer SFHP Medi-Cal members with Covid-19 or those exhibiting Covid-19 symptoms, directly to Project Open Hand for an MTM intervention. Those who are eligible and enrolled into the program will receive 3 weeks of medically tailored meals. They opened their 27th popup pantry at Golden Gate Senior Center and is serving 1,100 households from this location.</p> <p><u>SF New Deal (Lenore Estrada)</u> SF New Deal is celebrating the milestone of serving 500,000 meals and supporting local restaurants with \$5M in funding</p>
