Free Screening of Documentary, MisLead: America's Secret Epidemic

San Francisco, CA—Two special engagement preview screenings of the documentary film "MisLead: America's Secret Epidemic" are being sponsored by the San Francisco Department of Public Health Childhood Lead Prevention Program and Get the Lead Out, a Bay Area coalition of lead poisoning prevention leaders, on **Friday, October 25**th, free to the public.

"MisLead" is a ground-breaking film directed by Tamara Rubin, featuring stories of families with lead-poisoned children and contemporary interviews with the researchers behind the recent breakthroughs shaping new public policy. This film is timely in light of the recently-ended trial, *The People of California v. Atlantic Richfield Company et al.*, which deliberated the paint industry's role in exposing residents across California to lead paint hazards. Six of ten cities and counties that brought suit are in the Bay Area— City and County of San Francisco, Alameda County, City of Oakland, Santa Clara County, San Mateo County, Solano County, Monterey County, City of San Diego, Los Angeles County and Ventura County.
