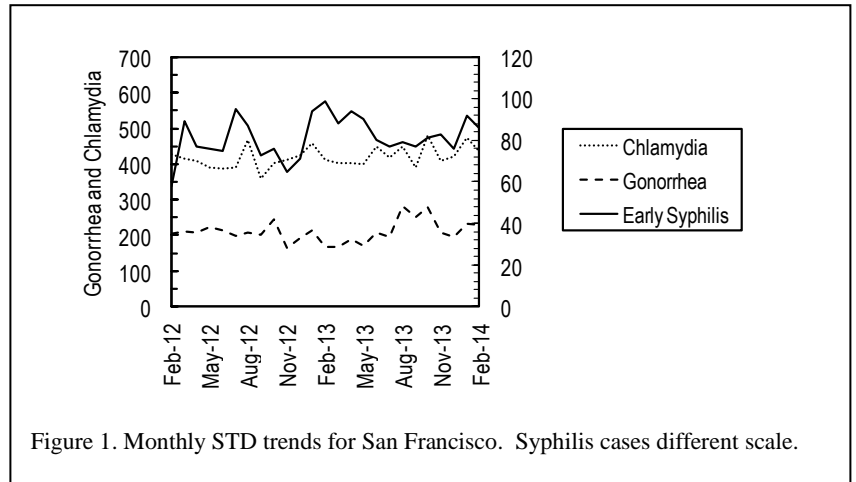


Figure 1. Monthly STD trends for San Francisco. Syphilis cases different scale.

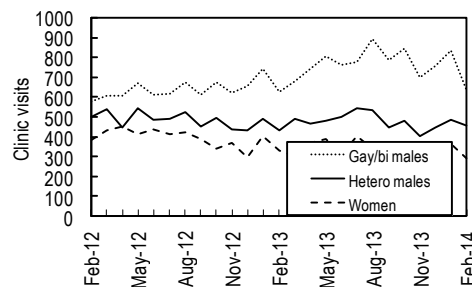


Figure 2. City Clinic visits by gender and orientation.

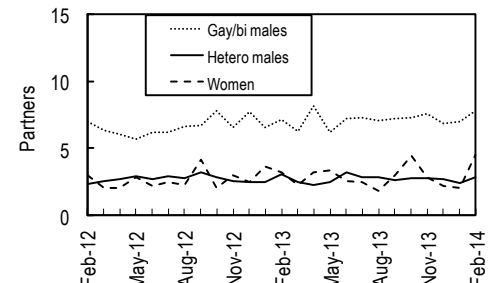


Figure 3. Average number of recent\* sex partners for City Clinic visits by gender and sexual orientation. \*Recall period is 3 months.

## April is STD Awareness Month

STD Awareness Month is almost here! The San Francisco Department of Public Health is embarking on its annual STD awareness campaign for adolescents and adults in San Francisco this April. This year our STD awareness activities will include events throughout the city to reach gay men and other men who have sex with men, as well as young males and females. The Youth United Through Health Education team (YUTHE) will be participating in a Bar/Club Blitz at City Nights on Friday, April 4 and on Saturday, April 26; as part of the promotion, they will distribute male condoms, Female Condom 2 (FC2), and sexual health and testing information. The YUTHE will also be participating in a local health fair hosted by the San Francisco State University sorority, Omicron Theta Chi, on Sunday, April 6 at Moscone Recreation Center.

As part of STD Awareness month, and in addition to our regular monthly testing activities, the Sexual Health Unit (SHU) will be working with the local drag softball team, the SF Knockers, to develop and produce a FC2 promotional video. The scheduled premiere for the FC2 video is Sunday, April 27, and the video will be played at the upcoming SF Knockers' Beer Busts.
