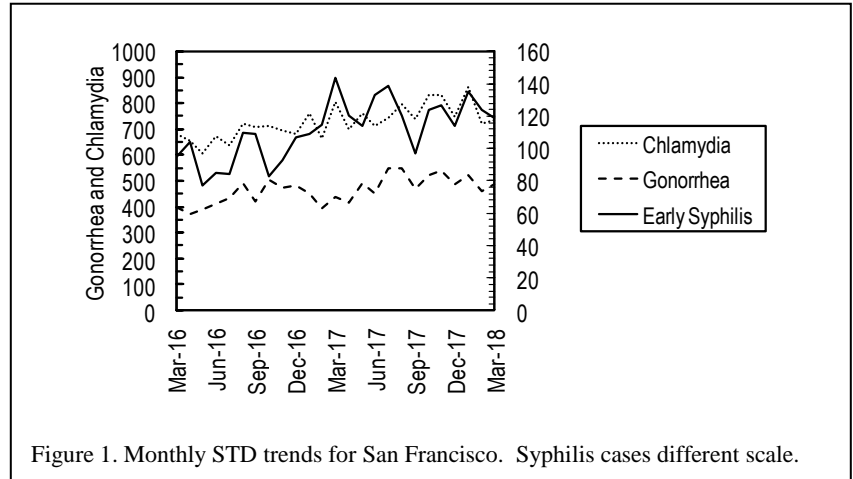


Figure 1. Monthly STD trends for San Francisco. Syphilis cases different scale.

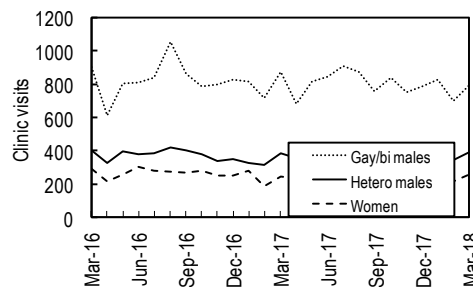


Figure 2. City Clinic visits by gender and orientation.

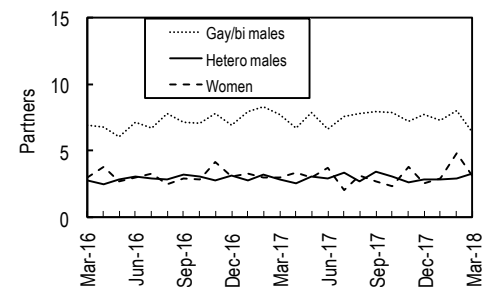


Figure 3. Average number of recent\* sex partners for City Clinic visits by gender and sexual orientation.

## One Stop PrEP at MISSION WELLNESS

Mission Wellness Pharmacy (MWP), in collaboration with SFDPH, has launched a new and innovative Pharmacist Delivered PrEP Program. This program, the first of its kind in California, aims to improve access to PrEP and reduce HIV disparities among communities of color in San Francisco.

The Mission Wellness Pharmacist Delivered PrEP program, named **One Stop PrEP at Mission Wellness** and located in SF's Mission District, will address the disparity in PrEP awareness, knowledge and uptake by providing culturally sensitive one-stop access to PrEP and STD testing services. Currently, individuals who would like to start taking PrEP need to schedule an appointment with a physician for required labs and a prescription. At MWP, clients will have access to free HIV, Hepatitis C and STD testing. If medically-eligible for PrEP, clients can also receive same-day PrEP on-site without having to see a physician.

This program was made possible through SF's "Getting To Zero" consortium ([www.gettingtozerosf.org](http://www.gettingtozerosf.org)), which aims to eliminate new HIV infections, deaths caused by HIV, and stigma associated with HIV.
