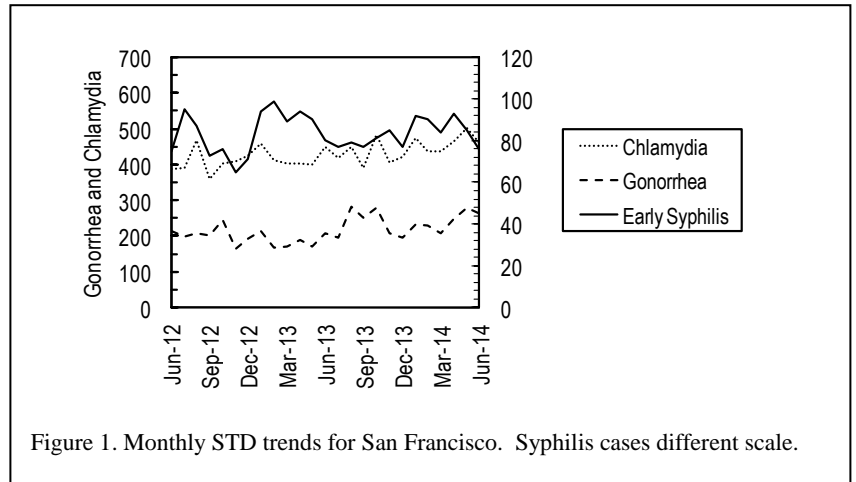


Figure 1. Monthly STD trends for San Francisco. Syphilis cases different scale.

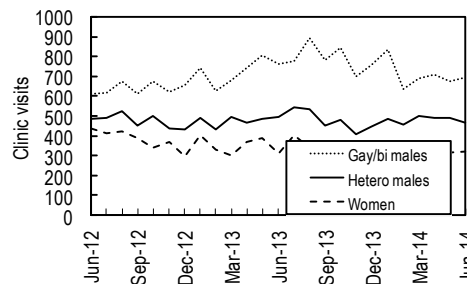


Figure 2. City Clinic visits by gender and orientation.

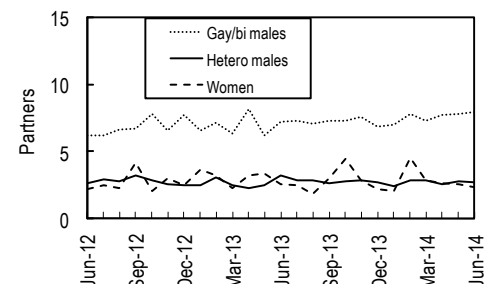


Figure 3. Average number of recent* sex partners for City Clinic visits by gender and sexual orientation. *Recall period is 3 months.

The Minority AIDS Initiative-Targeted Capacity Expansion (MAI-TCE) Program

The MAI-TCE Program is in its 2nd of a three-year demonstration project to reduce health disparities by addressing the complex health needs of individuals, particularly persons of color, affected by HIV, substance use, and mental illness. MAI-TCE expands San Francisco's capacity to address the behavioral health needs of people living with or at risk for HIV (PLWARH) within primary care and other medical settings. In order to maximize the benefits of the client's care, and to provide system-level recommendations, the MAI-TCE Evaluation staff conducts programmatic and client assessments.

Four MAI-TCE Behavioral Health Specialists are embedded in primary/HIV care teams. After the referral and screening process, they develop and implement a goal-oriented, short-term behavioral health treatment plan (i.e., improvement in coping/life skills, treatment adherence, reduction of symptoms and other goals related to better quality of life and health outcomes). **San Francisco City Clinic: The City Clinic Mind-Body Program** is the only site that accepts outside referrals (contact Luke Adams: 415- 487-5510). The other sites work with their in-house clients: Chronic Care HIV/AIDS Multidisciplinary Program Center of Excellence, Black Health and Women's Centers of Excellence, and Southeast Health Center Transitions Clinic. **UCSF Alliance Health Project** is conducting a drinking study for MSM and transwomen to provide early substance abuse interventions to reduce prevalence of binge drinking and associated risky sexual behavior. It is a brief, one-time intervention using Motivational Interviewing or Personalized Cognitive Counseling. Participants receive a \$20 gift card.
