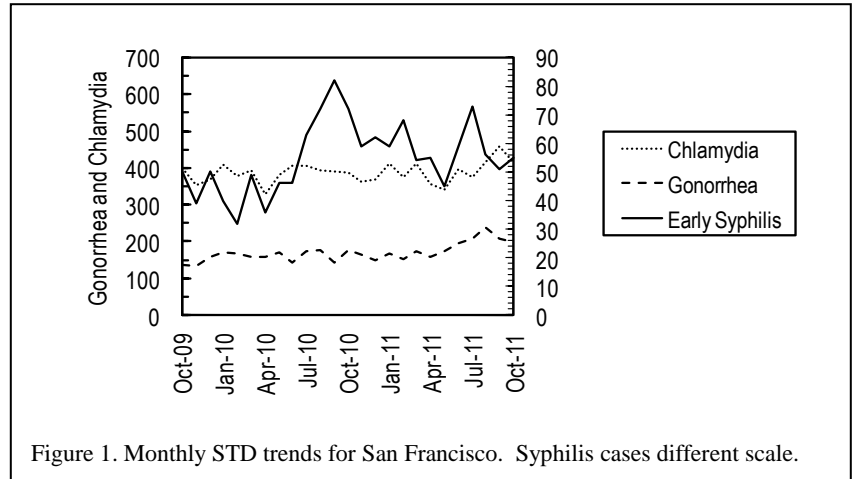


Figure 1. Monthly STD trends for San Francisco. Syphilis cases different scale.

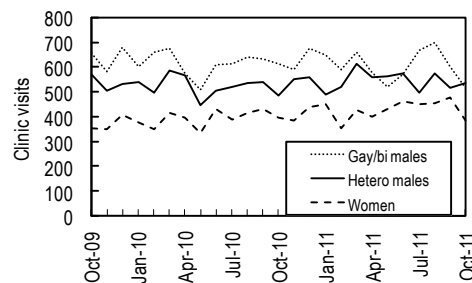


Figure 2. City Clinic visits by gender and orientation.

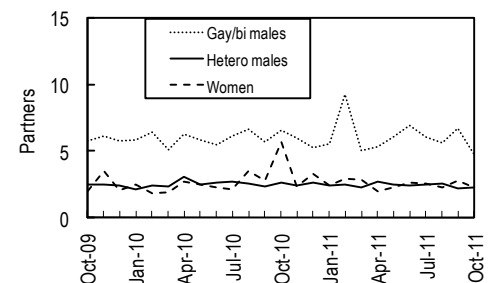


Figure 3. Average number of recent* sex partners for City Clinic visits by gender and sexual orientation. *Recall period is 3 months.

CDC Releases 2010 National STD Surveillance Summary

Nationally, CDC estimates 19 million new STIs annually, with an associated cost of \$17 billion. The 2010, STD Surveillance Summary describes recent trends in STDs in the United States. In 2010, 1.3 million cases of chlamydia were reported to CDC for a rate of 426 per 100,000; chlamydia diagnoses were up 5% from 2009 and 27% from 2007. Over 300,000 cases of gonorrhea were reported in 2010, for a rate of 100.8 per 100,000. Rates of gonorrhea continue to decline nationally. Finally, nearly 14,000 cases of primary and secondary syphilis were reported to CDC in 2010 for a rate of 4.5 per 100,000. 2010 was the first year to see a decline in primary and secondary syphilis in nearly a decade.
