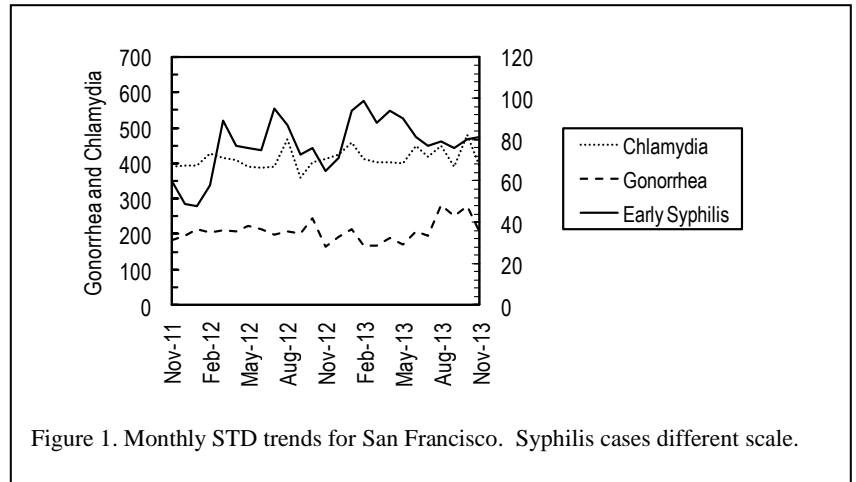


Figure 1. Monthly STD trends for San Francisco. Syphilis cases different scale.

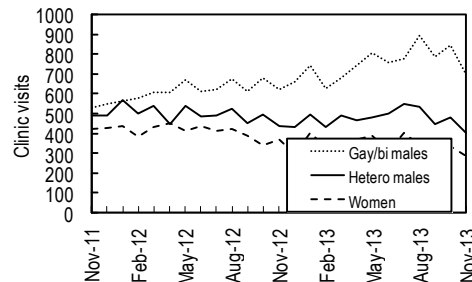


Figure 2. City Clinic visits by gender and orientation.

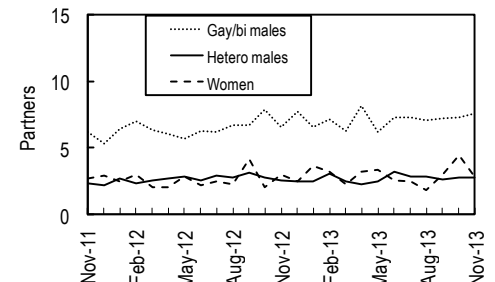


Figure 3. Average number of recent* sex partners for City Clinic visits by gender and sexual orientation. *Recall period is 3 months.

HIV Pre-Exposure Prophylaxis in San Francisco: The Demo Project

STD San Francisco City Clinic, in collaboration with Bridge HIV, has recently completed enrollment for **The Demo Project**. The Demo Project is the first demonstration project in the United States assessing the feasibility, safety and acceptability of pre-exposure prophylaxis (PrEP) implementation in STD and community health clinics. When taken daily, PrEP is highly effective at preventing HIV infection. As of December 2013, we have enrolled 300 participants in The Demo Project at San Francisco City Clinic, and over 235 at our sites in Miami, FL and Washington, DC. We will be presenting baseline results from the study at the Conference on Retroviruses and Opportunistic Infections (CROI) in March 2014; final results expected early 2015.

Demand for PrEP has been high across all three sites, and many of our participants are eager to continue PrEP as an HIV prevention tool after study completion.
