

#### **General Retail Tobacco Permitting**



City and County of San Francisco Department of Public Health: Environmental Health Branch



#### **NO NEW TOBACCO PERMITS**

- 1. Districts with 45 or more tobacco permits
- 2. New location
- Restaurant, Bar, or Tobacco Shop
- Within 500 feet of a school
- 5. Within 500 feet of another retailer

Active Tobacco Sales Permits



# Cessation Support

- Connect To Quit media campaign
  - † 45% more website traffic to ZSFG Support Group
  - † 68% increase in CA Smokers' Helpline callers from San Francisco
- 7 CBOs funded to deliver tobacco cessation services to priority populations
  - (2) for Black/African Americans at HopeSF sites
  - Latinx men; Chinese men
  - LGBTQ
  - Pacific Islanders
  - Youth











### Tobacco Prevention

- Annual Compliance Inspections
- Retail Tobacco Training
- City College / SF International High School Tobacco Prevention Partnership
- DOJ Grant proposal submitted (\$1.4 million over 3 years)
- Smoke-free Multi-Unit Housing (Supervisor Yee)
- Decoy Operations for Unpermitted Tobacco Retailers and/or Smoking Lounges (SUSPENDED due to COVID-19)
