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Explanation of Service Change and Variances:

The contract will be monitored in accordance with all applicable Departmental procedures.

Nondiscrimination and Cultural Competency:

The Contractor will participate in applicable cultural competency requirements for the upcoming year.

Sole Source:

Under section 21.42 of the Administrative Code, and due to the unique nature of the proposed services the Department has determined that that this contract is a Sole Source for the following reasons:

The University has implemented and is operating a fully functional and integrated Electronic Medical Records (EMR) system. A feature of the system in use by the University, is the ability for current users of the EMR, when certified by the EMR manufacturer, to extend its license to partner agencies via an Application Service Provider (ASP) model. The proposed consulting engagement between the University and the Department will undertake a detailed and thorough analysis of both the University's and Department IT infrastructure, and will also develop a detailed 10 year cost analysis of such an arrangement.

The detailed analysis will involve a thorough examination of the University's current technical environment which can only be performed by the University itself due to the proprietary nature of information that will be needed to be assessed in order to complete the analysis and deliver the 10 year cost analysis. In addition, both the University and the Department, as a function of their long standing Affiliation Agreement, share many resources such as an interconnected computer network, integrated clinical and operational functions, and the joint delivery of direct patient care to a highly specialized and complex patient population. All of the afore mention items must be considered in the evaluation and can only be evaluated by the University and Department.

Other Significant Issues:

The San Francisco Department of Public Health (the "Department") utilizes various Electronic Health Record ("EHR") systems within SFGH and throughout the San Francisco Health Network (SFHN). The primary EHR used to identify patients, register, bill and keep a clinical repository is Siemens (now Cerner) INVISION/LCR. This product was purchased in the mid-1990s and at the time was considered state of the art. Now twenty years later it is lacking the suite of integrated products that make up a modern her.

This year Cerner purchased several parts of Siemens healthcare, which included INVISION/LCR. Cerner stated that while INVISION/LCR will be supported it will not have any upgrades and will not meet the meaningful use stage III standards. SFGH is currently not meeting meaningful use stage II and will see almost a \$1M in Medicare penalties each year beginning in 2017 if it continues with the current system.

The proposed study is essential in evaluating the cost of one option to implement a new EHR system.
