Explanation of Service:

This is a new contract for the period of July 1, 2020 – June 30, 2023 (3 years). 18 Reasons will be responsible for providing services to address chronic disease prevention through Policy, Systems, Environment (PSE) level change projects related to sugary drink consumption and health equity through healthy food practices. The San Francisco Department of Public Health (SFDPH), Community Health Equity and Promotion Branch (CHEP) will work with 18 Reasons through community engagement. This community engagement will provide for meal preparation programs, virtual cooking techniques, and food purchasing and delivery for priority populations, specifically the Bayview area. In collaboration with the SDDT Advisory Committee, 18 Reasons will provide the community action model that engages in active policy change, system change, and physical environment change by addressing health, health equity and social determinants that impact health outcomes. Policy change that looks at organizational positions and their course of action, system changes address for how organizations can provide equity through the facilitation of organizational decisions or outcomes, and environmental change considers through observation of the physical environment social determinants that will address health, health equity and social determinants of health that impact health outcomes.

Monitoring Report/Program Review & Follow-Up:

The contract services will be monitored by the DPH Business Office of Contract Compliance (BOCC) and be included in the SDDT evaluation.

The SFDPH Program Administrator will be responsible for assessing and tracking all information related to the accomplishment of the project.
