CITY AND COUNTY OF SAN FRANCISCO. RESOLUTION NO. 59-86

RESOLUTION ACCEPTING THE REPORT ON THE CONTROL OF PERINATALLY TRANSMITTED HTLV-III/LAV ASSOCIATED VIRUS INFECTION AND CARE OF INFECTED MOTHERS, INFANTS AND PRE-SCHOOL AGED CHILDREN AND ADDPTING THE RECOMMENDATIONS AS OFFICIAL GUIDELINES FOR THE DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC HEALTH.

Whereas, the Department of Public Health has issued a report which contains information and recommendations on perinatal $\rm HTLV{\sim}III/LAV$ infection and pediatric AIDS which were developed and compiled by a task force of the Department of Public Health; and

the task force included representatives of the departments obstetrics and gynecology, medicine and pediatrics, and the AIDS Activities Unit, San Francisco Seneral Hospital, University of California, the San Francisco Medical Society; the American Academy of Pediatrics; the San Francisco Gynecologic Society, and the Department of Social Services, the City Attorney's Office, and the Juvenile Court of San Francisco; and

Whereas, the report contains recommendations on risk reduction education, laboratory testing procedures; pre-conception recommendations; identification of infected women; care of infected women and intravenous drug using mothers; and also contains recommendations on the identification of exposed infants and the care of exposed and infected infants and children which will protect and promote public health; and

Whereas, the members of the Health Commission support the recommendations made in the report; now therefore be it

RESOLVED, that the membership of the Perinatal and Pediatric AIDS Advisory Committee will be expanded to include members of ethnic and socio-economic populations which are at high risk; and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED; That the Health Commission accepts the report on policies regarding the control of the perinatally transmitted HTLV-III/LAV infection and the care of infected mothers, infants and pre-school aged children, and adopts the recommendations contained therein as guidelines for the Department of Public Health.
