RESOLUTION OF THE HEALTH COMMISSION TO ENDORSE AND ENCOURAGE A PILOT PROJECT AT SAN FRANCISCO GENERAL HOSPITAL TO INCREASE MINORITY AND WOMEN BUSINESS ENTERPRISE PARTICIPATION IN THE PROCUREMENT PROCESS.

Whereas, San Francisco General Hospital desires to exercise a leadership role in cooperation with the Purchaser to promote the spirit and implementation of the minority and women business development ordinance (MBE/WBE/LBE);

Whereas, in current practice minority/women and all small vendors are at a great disadvantage and unable to compete effectively;

Whereas, San Francisco General Hospital wishes to enter into a pilot program to demonstrate that minority/women business development can be cost effective for the citizens of the City and County of San Francisco and can provide quality service to the hospital;

Whereas, the San Francisco General Hospital pilot program will foster joint ventures and other innovative prime vendor programs for minority/women vendors in the community;

Whereas, a pilot program has the potential to increase minority/women procurement by \$1,000,000 in the first two years;

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Health Commission fully endorses and encourages a pilot project at San Francisco General Hospital designed to increase minority and women business enterprise participation in the procurement process;

AND BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that it is the policy of the Health Commission to make certain that all Divisions and Bureaus of the Department of Public Health have in place policies and procedures that will ensure maximum compliance with the MBE/WBE/LBE Ordinance No. 139-84.
