WHEREAS, Dr. Waddell made an especially significant contribution in his heroic approach to his death caused by AIDS; and,



BE IT RESOLVED, that the San Francisco Health Commission designate the 50 Ivy Street Clinic as the "Dr. Tom Waddell Clinic" dedicated to serving AIDS/ARC patients and others in the Civic Center area; and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Health Department representatives work with individuals who had been associated with Dr. Waddell to ensure that the "Dr. Tom Waddell Clinic" is publicly dedicated to his memory.
