RESOLUTION NO. 137-89

**A RESOLUTION URGING THE STATE DEPARTMENT OF MENTAL  
HEALTH TO ADMIT SAN FRANCISCO PATIENTS INTO NAPA STATE HOSPITAL UP TO  
THE SAN FRANCISCO ALLOCATION FOR FY 1989-90**

WHEREAS, The City and County purchased an additional 1,000 Napa State Hospital days in FY 1989-89 in order to meet the actual need for state hospital services; and,

WHEREAS, the County's allocation for Napa State Hospital days was increased from 89,869 to 90,869 in FY 1987-88, and then re-adjusted to 89,351 for FY 1988-89; and


WHEREAS, the State has not admitted clinically appropriate San Francisco patients to Napa State Hospital; and,

WHEREAS, the use of Napa State Hospital for FY 1987-88 was 79,930 or 10,939 days under allocation and the projected usage for FY 1988-89 is approximately 84,557 based on current utilization patients which is 4,794 days under the allocation; and,

WHEREAS, restriction of admission at Napa has caused over-utilization of inpatient and emergency services in San Francisco acute care facilities, now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that the Health Commission urges the State Department of Mental Health to permit admission of clinically appropriate patients up to the allocated beds, or refund the cost of unused days.
