RESOLUTION NO. 17-90

RESOLUTION REGARDING
AB 75 DATA REQUIREMENTS AND HEALTH CARE

WHEREAS, the legislature of the State of California passed AB 75 in order to carry out the voters' intentions in enacting Prop 99, the Tobacco Tax Initiative; and

WHEREAS, to achieve the goals of AB 75 to provide indigent care services through county health service delivery systems, the legislature has mandated the development of data reporting systems to monitor and report patient characteristics, utilization and expenditures for medical care services provided to indigents; and

WHEREAS, AB 75 makes available, upon application, \$10 million statewide for the development and implementation of county Medically Indigent Care Reporting Systems (MICRS); and

WHEREAS, that the Department of Public Health desires to develop and make more efficient its health care delivery system for indigents and will use the data reporting capabilities of MICRS to better manage county health services; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that the Department of Public Health will submit an application for MICRS development funds to the State of California, Department of Health Services; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Department will continue with a strategic planning process, including the indigent, to develop its health care delivery system which will optimally use the MICRS data reporting capabilities for program management.
