RESOLUTION ON THE PROPOSED MERGER OF PACIFIC PRESBYTERIAN AND CHILDREN'S HOSPITALS

- WHEREAS, the Health Care Planning Ordinance stipulates that prior to a hospital inpatient or outpatient facility leasing, selling or transferring of management, public notice will be given to the San Francisco Health Commission; and,
- WHEREAS, the Health Commission held a public hearing on October 2, 1990, to determine whether the proposed merger of Pacific Presbyterian Medical Center (PPMC) and Northern California Health Center (Children's Hospital) would or would not be detrimental to health care service of the community; and,
- WHEREAS, testimony was presented by administrative officials from both hospitals that the proposed merger at this time is strictly a proposal to merge the Board of Directors, medical and administrative staffs of the two hospitals; and,
- WHEREAS, the testimony further stipulated that at this time there is no proposal to effect a reduction in services or staff at either hospital; now, therefore, be it
- RESOLVED, that the San Francisco Health Commission finds that the proposed merger of PPMC and Children's Hospital as described will not have a detrimental impact on the health care service of the community.
