RESOLUTION NO. 20-91

RESOLUTION ON SUSPENSION OF THE BONE MARROW
TRANSPLANT SERVICE PROGRAM

WHEREAS, the Health Care Planning Ordinance stipulates that prior to a hospital inpatient or outpatient facility reducing or eliminating any of its services, public notice will be given to the San Francisco Health Commission; and

WHEREAS, on July 16, 1991 the California Pacific Medical Center formally informed the Health Commission that effective July 1, 1991 the Bone Marrow Transplant Service Program was suspended as necessitated by the resignation of the program's Acting Medical Director; and

WHEREAS, the Health Commission held a public hearing on this matter on August 6, 1991; and

WHEREAS, this program may be reinstated in the development of the major Cancer Center being contemplated by California Pacific Medical Center; and

WHEREAS, follow-up care of all post transplant patients has been transferred to qualified physicians in the area; now, therefore,

WHEREAS, there continues to be available bone marrow transplant services in this community, including the University of California at San Francisco; and now therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED, that the Health Commission determines that the suspension of the Bone Marrow Transplant Service Program at California Pacific Medical Center will not have a detrimental impact on the health care service of the community.
