RESOLUTION NO. 21-91

RESOLUTION ENDORSING THE MAYOR'S HUMAN IMMUNODEFICIENCY
VIRUS (HIV) HEALTH SERVICES PLANNING COUNCIL DETERMINATION
OF THE ALLOCATION OF RYAN WHITE COMPREHENSIVE AIDS
RESOURCES EMERGENCY (CARE) ACT OF 1990 FUNDS/TITLE II

WHEREAS, the CARE Act of 1990 was established by the Congress of the United States to provide disaster relief to localities disproportionately affected by the AIDS/HIV epidemic and to make financial assistance available to State and local governments or other nonprofit entities to provide for the development, organization, coordination and operation of more effective and cost efficient services to individuals and families with HIV disease; and,

WHEREAS, this legislation required the Mayor of San Francisco to establish an HIV Health Services Planning Council composed of a broad representation of the full range of entities that provide, sponsor, or facilitate such services within the geographic area to be served; and,

WHEREAS, this HIV Health Services Planning Council was by legislation required to and has established funding priorities within the eligible area and developed a comprehensive plan for the organization and delivery of AIDS/HIV health services compatible with existing State and local services; and,

WHEREAS, this HIV Health Services Planning Council will act as the consortium for the administration of California State Department of Health Services dispensed CARE Title II funds in San Francisco; and,

WHEREAS, the Planning Council has determined that funds be disbursed to low-income, uninsured, and/or underinsured persons with special emphasis on previously neglected or unrepresented individuals and those who can no longer care for themselves; and,

WHEREAS, the CARE Title II funds are designated for case management services, home care services, technical assistance to the community, and the continued support of activities formerly funded by the AIDS/ARC Service Demonstration Project; and,

WHEREAS, the Planning Council has endeavored to expedite the allocation of all funds by local funding mechanisms in order to comply with the provisions of the CARE Act of 1990 and with the stipulation of the California State Department of Health Services that all CARE Title II funded contractors be identified and contracts be fully negotiated by September 30, 1991; and,

WHEREAS, the Planning Council has determined that the CARE Title II funds be disbursed in the following manner:
