RESOLUTION ON WOMEN'S HEALTH

WHEREAS, in 1987 a report on Women's Health in the City and County of San Francisco was presented to the Health Commission; and in 1991 a report was presented to the Commission on the Status of Women; and,

WHEREAS, the report seeks to provide an overview of the status of women's health care as it exists within the San Francisco public and non-profit health systems; and,

WHEREAS, with the decreasing commitment at the Federal and State levels for health care, the report identifies priorities that will affect the delivery of women's health care in San Francisco by the Department of Public Health and other providers and require careful planning on how health care services to women are delivered; and,

WHEREAS the report identifies priorities for women's health care that are important to consider while developing an overall program of health care for all residents of this city; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that the Health Commission accepts the report dated January 1991 on Women's Health Issues in San Francisco; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Health Commission will consider the recommendations of the Department of Public Health Women's Health Committee.
