PROPOSED AMENDMENT TO THE
RESOLUTION ON WOMEN'S HEALTH

WHEREAS, in 1987 a report on Women's Health in the City and County of San Francisco was presented to the Health Commission; and in 1991 a report was presented to the Commission on the Status of Women; and,

WHEREAS, the report seeks to provide an overview of the status of women's health care as it exists within the San Francisco public and non-profit health systems; and,


WHEREAS, with the decreasing commitment at the Federal and State levels for health care, the report identifies priorities that will affect the delivery of women's health care in San Francisco by the Department of Public Health and other providers and require careful planning on how health care services to women are delivered; and,

WHEREAS, it is appropriate to have a Women's Health Committee representing the broad and diverse perspectives of women's needs to assist the Department in understanding these needs; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that the Health Commission requests the Department of Public Health to form a Women's Health Committee to represent the broad and diverse perspectives of women, including women of color, as an on-going advisory body to the Department of Public Health with a Department staff liaison assigned to the Committee; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, that this Advisory Committee report annually.
