RESOLUTION NO. 5--91

EMERGENCY RESOLUTION OF THE HEALTH COMMISSION
TO REQUEST FUNDS FOR THE MOUNT ZION CRISIS CLINIC
WHICH IS SCHEDULED TO CLOSE MARCH 1, 1991

WHEREAS, the Health Commission is committed to the development of a comprehensive psychiatric emergency service system for the City and County of San Francisco; and,

WHEREAS, the Health Commission also acknowledges the serious financial constraints imposed by Federal and State budgets; and,

WHEREAS, in response to the Board of Supervisors' Resolution #30-91-1, representatives of the Health Commission met with representatives of Mount Zion Health Systems Board and the University of California at San Francisco on February 19, 1991; and,


WHEREAS, the Mount Zion Health Systems Board is unable to commit any further financial assistance to the Mount Zion Crisis Clinic and had made a decision to close March 1, 1991; and

WHEREAS, the University of California at San Francisco is willing to provide some limited "in kind" support for the Mount Zion Crisis Clinic; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that the Health Commission direct that between March 1 and April 1, 1991 the Department staff along with Mount Zion Crisis Clinic staff finalize what the future role of the Clinic might be in a restructured comprehensive psychiatric emergency service system; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Health Commission will request a supplemental to fund the Crisis Clinic from March 1 to April 1, 1991 at the current level of operations, and to fund the Crisis Clinic from April 1 to July 1, 1991 at a level necessary for transition or closure of the program effective on or before July 1, 1991.
