**RESOLUTION TO RECOMMEND ADOPTION OF THE REVISED  
HAZARDOUS MATERIALS ORDINANCE**

WHEREAS, the purpose of the Hazardous Materials Ordinance is to protect the health, safety and welfare of the community, the environment, and emergency response personnel; and,

WHEREAS, the Hazardous Materials Ordinance incorporates provisions of state and federal laws pertaining to the regulation of hazardous materials, and underground storage tanks; and,

WHEREAS, the estimated number of hazardous materials storage facilities in San Francisco is approximately 10,000 and the number of underground storage tanks is approximately 2,000; and,

WHEREAS, the Department of Public Health is mandated by the Hazardous Materials Ordinance to generate by fees sufficient revenues to cover all costs for implementation and enforcement of the ordinance; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that the San Francisco Health Commission recommend adoption of the proposed revisions to the Hazardous Materials Ordinance.
