**RESOLUTION TO RECOMMEND RE-DESIGNATION OF THE
BUREAU OF ENVIRONMENTAL HEALTH SERVICES
AS THE LOCAL ENFORCEMENT AGENCY FOR SOLID WASTE**

- WHEREAS, the State Legislature enacted the California Integrated Solid Waste Management Act requiring local governing bodies to designate a Local Enforcement Agency (LEA) for solid waste issues; and,
- WHEREAS, the designated LEA must be certified by the California Integrated Waste Management Board (CIWMB) by August 1, 1992 or the CIWMB will become the LEA; and,
- WHEREAS, the Department of Public Health was designated as the enforcement agency by Resolution of the Board of Supervisors on August 22, 1977; and,
- WHEREAS, the Bureau of Environmental Health Services, as the designated representative of the Department has continually served as the Local Enforcement Agency; now, therefore, be it
- RESOLVED, that the San Francisco Health Commission recommends that the Bureau of Environmental Health Services continue as the Local Enforcement Agency for the City and County of San Francisco.
