RESOLUTION NO. 23-93

**APPROVING AN AMENDMENT TO THE SAN FRANCISCO
ADMINISTRATIVE CODE RELATING TO THE ACCEPTANCE OF GIFTS**

WHEREAS, from time to time gifts, donations, and contributions of money and personal property are made for the general benefit and comfort of the patients of the Department of Public Health; and


WHEREAS, the Administrative Code currently provides that all gifts made to San Francisco General or Laguna Honda Hospitals in value or amount of \$5,000 or more must be accepted by the Board of Supervisors; and

WHEREAS, obtaining acceptance from the Board of Supervisors of small gifts is unnecessarily costly in terms of administrative time and overhead; and,

WHEREAS, most gifts made to divisions of the Department of Public Health are smaller than \$25,000 in value or amount; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that the San Francisco Health Commission approves the amendment to the Administrative Code, which allows for the Health Commission to accept gifts or less than \$25,000 in value or amount, such amount to be increased by five percent (5%) each fiscal year beginning July 1, 1994; and further recommends it for approval to the Board of Supervisors and the Mayor of the City and County of San Francisco.
