CITY AND COUNTY OF SAN FRANCISCO RESOLUTION NO. 29-93

SUPPORTING THE ADVANCED DIRECTIVES PROGRAMS

- WHEREAS, the Department of Public Health Mission Statement states that the Department shall assess, evaluate, educate and disseminate information regarding conditions that affect the public's health; and
- WHEREAS, the Patient Self Determination Act of 1991 requires hospitals, skilled nursing facilities, hospices and home health agencies participating in the Medicare and Medicaid programs to give patients information about their right to make their own health care decisions including the right to accept or refuse medical treatment and requires providers to educate their staffs and the community on issues related to advanced directives; and
- WHEREAS, all individuals have the right to decide among health care options; and
- WHEREAS, Advanced Directives apply only when an individual has lost their decisionmaking capacity; and
- WHEREAS, the State Emergency Medical Authority Prehospital Do Not Resuscitate
 Guidelines were issued in 1993 to encourage the adoption of local Prehospital Do Not
 Resuscitate Programs; and
- WHEREAS, the Emergency Medical Services Agency has developed a policy to permit EMS personnel to recognize the Prehospital Do Not Resuscitate form, now, therefore, be it
- RESOLVED, the Health Commission supports the rights of patients to make their own health care decisions including the right to accept or refuse medical treatment; and, be it
- FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Health Commission supports the Department of Health's plan to disseminate information regarding advanced directives to health care providers and the clients served by Department; and, be it
- FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Health Commission approves the Prehospital Do Not Resuscitate Program.
