RESOLUTION NO. 13-94

**APPROVING THE DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC HEALTH'S MANAGEMENT
INFORMATION SYSTEM'S STRATEGIC DIRECTION AND PROGRAM PLAN**

WHEREAS, the Department of Public Health must reorganize into a comprehensive integrated, cost-effective delivery system that focuses on prevention, primary care and chronic, long-term care; and

WHEREAS, the Department must transition to a managed care model with capitated funding in a shared risk environment; and,

WHEREAS, one of the critical factors in establishing an integrated, cost-effective delivery system is the presence of an effective automated information system; and,

WHEREAS, the Department's present installed information system is unable to meet the clinical and business functional demands of a managed care delivery system due to its obsolescence and limited functionality; and,

WHEREAS, the Department has conducted a thorough assessment of its needs, including a comparative analysis and risk assessment of health care technology in the marketplace; and,

WHEREAS, the Department has developed a Six-Year Management Information Systems Project Plan consistent with Department's recently adopted Strategic Direction; and

WHEREAS, it is recognized that the Management Information Systems strategic planning must reflect and be consistent with the evolving nature of the Department's Strategic Direction and reorganization; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that the San Francisco Health Commission approves the Department's Management Information System's Strategic Direction and Program Plan; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, that the San Francisco Health Commission regards the Management Information Systems Program Plan as a critical priority for the Department, and expenditures for implementing the Strategic Direction and Program Plan will be considered a top priority with an annual review and approval process.
