RESOLUTION NO. 25-94

**AUTHORIZING APPROVAL OF AN  
AMENDMENT TO THE SAN FRANCISCO COUNTY  
ADULT DAY HEALTH CARE PLAN**

WHEREAS, State statutes and regulations require counties to amend the County Adult Day Health Care Plan whenever service area boundaries need to be changed as recommended and approved by the local Adult Day Health Planning Council; and,

WHEREAS, the local Adult Day Health Planning Council is appointed by the County Board of Supervisors and approved by the Department of Aging to plan for organized day programs of therapeutic, social and health activities and services provided to the elderly and persons with functional impairments either physical or mental, for the purpose of restoring or maintaining optimal capacity for self care; and,

WHEREAS, the San Francisco County Adult Day Health Care Plan has a limit of one provider per catchment area, except for special populations with special need; and,

WHEREAS, the San Francisco Adult Day Health Care Plan was amended on October 1, 1991 eliminating Service Area #3 because of the lack of a provider and requested that the Institute on Aging/Ruth Ann Rosenberg Adult Day Health Center, a.k.a. Service Area #7, expand their service areas to fill in due to the lack of a service provider, today amends the plan to reinstate Service Area #3 with services provided by Self Help for the Elderly in an area bounded by the beach, the Presidio, Fulton Avenue and Park Presidio; and,

WHEREAS, these amendments were made in accordance with State mandated procedures and formalized by the Adult Day Health Care Planning Council on April 13, 1994; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that the Health Commission supports the amendment to the San Francisco County Adult Day Health Care Plan; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Health Commission recommends these amendments to the Board of Supervisors for approval and submission to the State Department of Aging.
