THE
MAXINE HALL HEALTH CENTER**

WHEREAS, the Department of Public Health is committed to the principle of community oriented primary care; and,

WHEREAS, the community based health centers administered by the Department of Public Health embody the essential characteristics of community oriented primary care by providing multidisciplinary health services reflecting the individual and community health needs identified in collaboration with the communities being served; and,


WHEREAS, the name of a health center can make a strong symbolic statement about the relationship between that health center and the community it serves; and,

WHEREAS, the tragic death of Maxine Hall, a patient at Health Center #2, led to renewed community efforts to reduce the impact that violence has on the health and well being of the community; and,

WHEREAS, in collaboration with the Health Center #2 Community Advisory Board, and with the support of Maxine Hall Health Center in order to memorialize her death and to state a commitment to continue the community effort to reduce the threat of violence to their health and well being; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that the San Francisco Health Commission of the City and County of San Francisco does hereby urge the Board of Supervisors to rename Health Center #2 the **Maxine Hall Health Center**.
