**DETERMINING WHETHER THE CONSOLIDATION
OF INPATIENT PEDIATRIC SERVICES OF CALIFORNIA PACIFIC
MEDICAL CENTER WILL OR WILL NOT BE DETRIMENTAL TO THE
HEALTH SERVICE OF THE COMMUNITY**

WHEREAS, the clinical configuration of the major campuses of California Pacific Medical Center are being restructured to facilitate the optimal delivery of inpatient and outpatient care; and,


WHEREAS, the consolidation of inpatient pediatric services at the Pacific Campus has been approved by the California Pacific Medical Center Board of Directors; and,

WHEREAS, California Pacific Medical Center has in good faith complied with the spirit of the Community Health Care Planning Ordinance (Prop. Q); and,

WHEREAS, on January 18, 1994 the Health Commission held a public hearing at which representatives of California Pacific Medical Center and the public presented testimony; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that the San Francisco Health Commission determines that the consolidation of inpatient pediatric services at the Pacific Campus will not be detrimental to the health services of the community.
