RESOLUTION NO. 30-95

**ENDORISING THE DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC HEALTH APPLICATION
FOR CERTIFICATION AS A UNIFIED PROGRAM AGENCY**

WHEREAS, Chapter 6.11 of the California Health and Safety Code requires the consolidation of six hazardous waste and hazardous materials programs to create a "Certified Unified Program Agency" (CUPA); and,

WHEREAS, Chapter 6.11 of the California Health and Safety Code further requires that all Counties apply for certification as a Unified Program Agency prior to December 31, 1995; and,

WHEREAS, the City and County of San Francisco, through the Department of Public Health, currently administers the hazardous waste and hazardous materials programs that are required to be administered by a Certified Unified Program; and,

WHEREAS, the consolidation of programs required under a Certified Unified Program is consistent with the overall Departmental goal to streamline and improve program efficiency and service delivery; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that the San Francisco Health Commission endorses the Department of Public Health application to the California Department of Toxic Substances Control for certification as a Unified Program Agency; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, that the San Francisco Health Commission urges the Mayor and the Board of Supervisors to approve the Department of Public Health application for certification as a Unified Program Agency.
