RESOLUTION NO. 37-95

**APPROVING A COMMERCIAL MANAGED CARE
AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH
AND PACIFICARE HEALTH PLAN**

WHEREAS, the Federal Government is encouraging all Medicare beneficiaries to join managed care plans and, furthermore, requires that all contracting entities have experience administering a commercial managed care agreement prior to entering into a Medicare managed care agreement; and,

WHEREAS, the provision of maintaining Medicare and employee health services is in keeping with the Department's Mission and Strategic Direction; and,

WHEREAS, the Department currently has a PacifiCare Medi-Cal contract and is expanding its relationship with PacifiCare by entering into a commercial agreement to continue to gain more experience in managed care and participate in PacifiCare's Medicare managed care plan, *Secure Horizons*; and,


WHEREAS, two commercial capitated agreements have been negotiated with PacifiCare: one with the Department of Health for hospital services, and the other with the UCSF Clinical Practice Group for medical services; and,

WHEREAS, the Commission has previously approved a resolution enabling City employees to choose providers at either SFGH or the Community Public Health Centers through the City Health Plan, and this agreement extends that opportunity to University of California employees at the SFGH Campus; and,

WHEREAS, these agreements set forth the rights, obligations, and risks for PacifiCare, the Department of Health, and the University of California; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that the San Francisco Health Commission approves the commercial managed care agreement with PacifiCare Health Plan and also urges the Board of Supervisors and the Mayor to approve this agreement.
