**SUPPORTING THE SEISMIC RETROFIT PROJECT
OF 101 GROVE STREET**

WHEREAS, the Earthquake Safety Program II Bond was represented to the electorate with a scope of work which included the seismic retrofit of 101 Grove Street; and,

WHEREAS, the electorate passed the Earthquake Safety Program II Bond with the public trust that 101 Grove Street would be seismically retrofit; and,

WHEREAS, the Department of Public Health building located at 101 Grove Street is located within the National Register of Historic Places, "San Francisco Civic Center Historic District", created in 1978 and designated Landmark No. 78000757; and,

WHEREAS, essential laboratory services are provided for the community at 101 Grove Street; and,

WHEREAS, the Tom Wadell Clinic provides direct health care services for the public at 101 Grove Street; and,

WHEREAS, birth and death certificates are provided for the public at 101 Grove Street; and,

WHEREAS, the Health Commission and approximately 300 employees conduct public business at 101 Grove Street; and,

WHEREAS, the Department of Public Works has commissioned a structural analysis of 101 Grove Street which indicates a seismic safety retrofit is required; and,

WHEREAS, sufficient funds can be made available by the Department of Public Works to proceed with the seismic retrofit of 101 Grove Street; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that the San Francisco Health Commission strongly supports the Seismic Retrofit Project of 101 Grove Street as being in the best interest of public safety and community health care services, and recommends that the Mayor, Board of Supervisors and the Chief Administrative Officer commit funds from the ESP Earthquake Safety Program II Bond and proceed with the project immediately.
